ryaku fusatsu

Shakyamuni Buddha's monks and nuns gathered on full-moon and new-moon days, sitting and meditating together. They also recited the more than 200 rules governing their everyday life. This recitation developed into a ceremony during which they would speak up if they had violated any of the rules and would vow to do better.

Once a month in Mahayana Buddhism now, the "Abbreviated Full-Moon Ceremony" (ryaku fusatsu) uses the 16 Bodhisattva Precepts, and any acknowledgement is made silently. Participating in this ceremony is an opportunity to take responsibility for one's past actions and reconnect to the Bodhisattva Way.
